HMS WAGER

70TH ANNIVERSARY OF HER LAUNCH + OTHER 70TH ANNIVERSARIES

All Saints' Day, Friday 1 November 2013 is the 70th anniversary of the launch of yard number 603 at John Brown's shipyard, Clydebank, on the River Clyde.

HMS *Wager* was launched on Monday 1 November 1943 but the name of the lady sponsor is not known.

Future 70th anniversaries, in 2014-2016, in the story and life of HMS *Wager* include:

(August 1943 – Engineer Officer joined HMS *Wager* at <u>John Brown's yard</u>) 22 Dec 1943 – Torpedo Officer (Gunner T – the electrical officer) joined HMS *Wager* 3 Feb 1944 – First Lieutenant joined HMS *Wager* at <u>John Brown's yard</u>, <u>Clydebank</u> mid-Feb/early Mar 1944 – Other ship's officers and key departmental senior ratings joined ship at <u>John Brown's yard</u>

28 Feb 1944 – Lt Cdr R C Watkin joined HMS Wager as Commanding Officer
28 Mar 1944 – Cook ratings joined HMS Wager to clean and commission galley;
1 Apr 1944 – Two Midshipmen join HMS Wager

2 Apr 1944 – Advance party of the Ship's Company joined: officers and ratings moved from digs ashore in <u>Clydebank</u> to living on board ship

3 Apr 1944 – Remaining majority of ship's company joined and moved straight on board; simple commissioning service held on board conducted by naval chaplain **5 Apr 1944** – HMS *Wager* sailed Clydebank for her first day at sea: Acceptance Trials undertaken over next two weeks

14 Apr 1944 – HMS *Wager* formally completed by shipbuilder and accepted by the Admiralty, becoming part of the Home Fleet

14/15 April 1944 – HMS *Wager* sailed from the River Clyde on the west coast of Scotland, <u>around the north of the British Isles</u>, to <u>Rosyth Naval Base</u> on the east coast of Scotland (595 nautical miles direct, taking about 1½ days at an average speed of 18 knots; it's just 55 miles by road!)

18 Apr 1944 (tbc) – HMS *Wager* sailed Rosyth, north for Scapa Flow **7 May 1944** – HMS *Wager* sailed from <u>Scapa Flow</u>, Orkney Islands, with task force on <u>Operation Hoops</u> to waters off the coast off <u>south Norway</u>; returned to Scapa Flow 9 May 1944

(**10-13 May 1944** – <u>HM King George VI visited the Home Fleet</u> at Scapa Flow) **12 May 1944** – HMS *Wager* sailed <u>Scapa Flow</u> with task force on <u>Operation Potluck</u> to carry out strikes against enemy shipping off the Norwegian coast, returning to Scapa Flow on 16 May 1944

28 May 1944 – HMS *Wager* sailed <u>Scapa Flow</u> with task force for <u>Operation *Tiger*</u> <u>*Claw*</u> north to waters around the <u>Faroe Islands</u>, returning the afternoon 2 Jun 1944

1 July 1944 – HMS *Wager* arrived Greenock, at the mouth of the River Clyde, alongside the depot ship HMS Sandhurst for short refit; Ship's Company granted one to two weeks' Foreign Service Leave from 5 Jul 1944 before deploying to Far East July 1944 - HMS Wager joined 27th Destroyer Flotilla 26 Jul 1944 – HMS Wager sailed Greenock for the Eastern Fleet in the Pacific 1 Aug 1944 – HMS Wager arrived Gibraltar; sailed 10 Aug 1944 **11 Aug 1944** – HMS *Wager* arrived Algiers; sailed 13 Aug 1944 15 Aug 1944 – HMS Wager arrived Malta; sailed 17 Aug 1944 19 Aug 1944 – HMS Wager arrived Alexandria; sailed 25 Aug 1944 for Suez Canal 29 Aug 1944 – HMS Wager arrived Aden; sailed 31 Aug 1944 5 Sep 1944 – HMS Wager crossed Equator: Crossing the Line ceremony 7 Sep 1944 7 Sep 1944 – HMS Wager anchored in Addu Atoll, Maldives; sailed 8 Sep 1944 9 Sep 1944 – HMS Wager arrived Colombo, Ceylon; sailed 11 Sep 1944 10 Sep 1944 – Commander-in-Chief, Admiral Sir Bruce Fraser visited HMS Wager 12 Sep 1944 – HMS Wager arrived Trincomalee, Ceylon; sailed 15 Oct 1944 22 Nov 1944 – HMS Wager formally joined British Pacific Fleet

2 Sep 1945 – HMS *Wager* in Tokyo Bay for formal surrender of Japan

14 Dec 1945 – HMS Wager sailed Singapore for Portsmouth

14 Jan 1946 – HMS *Wager* arrived Portsmouth (for the first time) to pay off > allocated to the Reserve Fleet, Portsmouth
